



Mary is sitting at her desk. She can't draw very well. "It's too hard," she says.





David is Mary's friend. He loves art class. He can draw very well.

"You can use circles, triangles, and ovals," he says.




David shows Mary how to draw a farmer.

"You can use ovals and triangles."




Now Mary can draw all on her own. She draws a picture of a beautiful farm.
