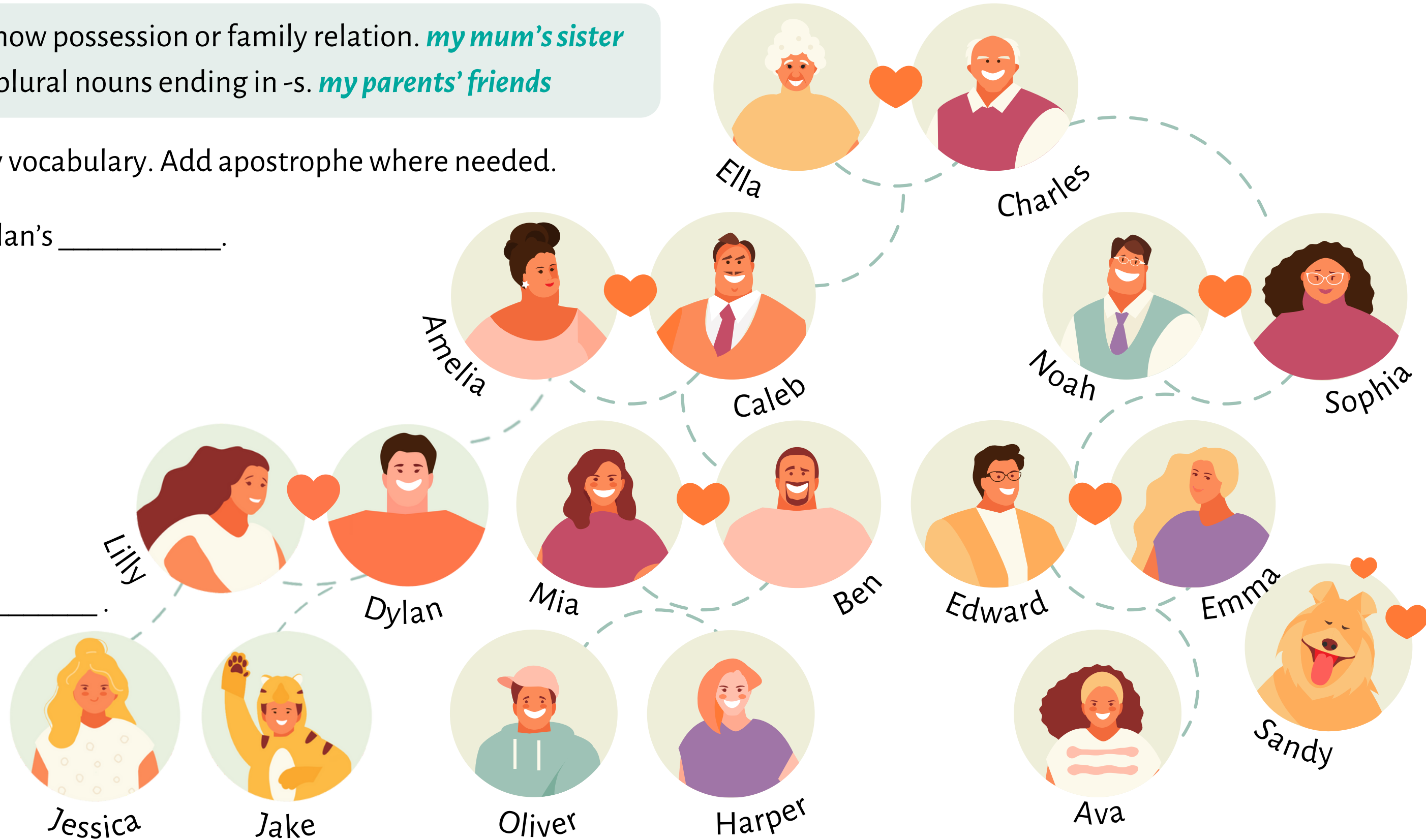


POSSESSIVE 'S

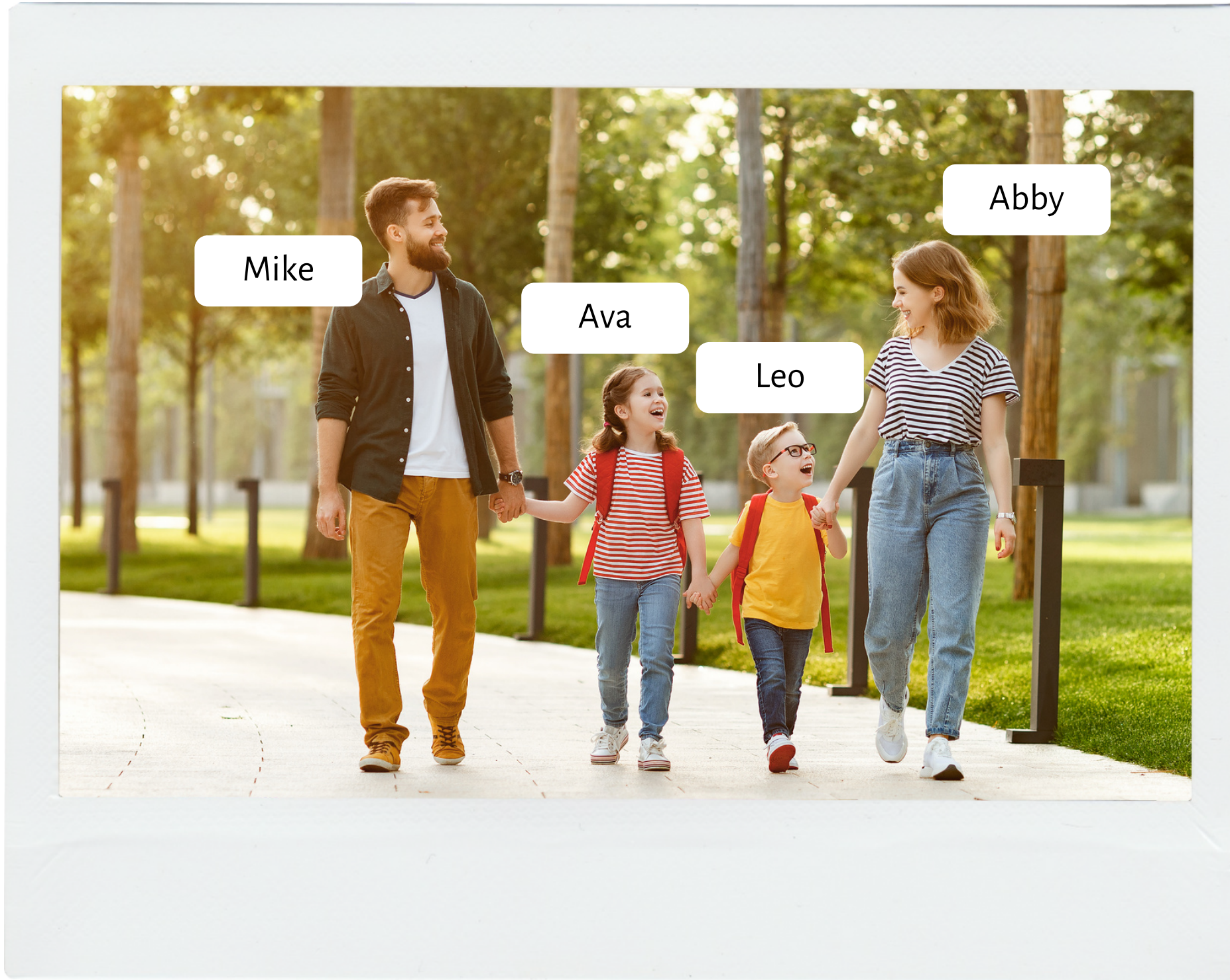

PHOTO STORY

*Optional activity for groups
to practice possessive 's.*

- Before the lesson, ask each student to take a photo of an object that belongs to them. It could be anything from a favourite book to a personal item.
- Share your screen to display the students' photos.
- Ask the students to observe the photos and think about whose possession the objects might be.
- Encourage students to create a sentence using possessive 's to describe the relationship between the student and the object. For example, *"I think it's Abby's book."*
- Invite students to share their sentences and guesses about the owner of the object.
- Create an atmosphere of curiosity and excitement by discussing the various possibilities.
