

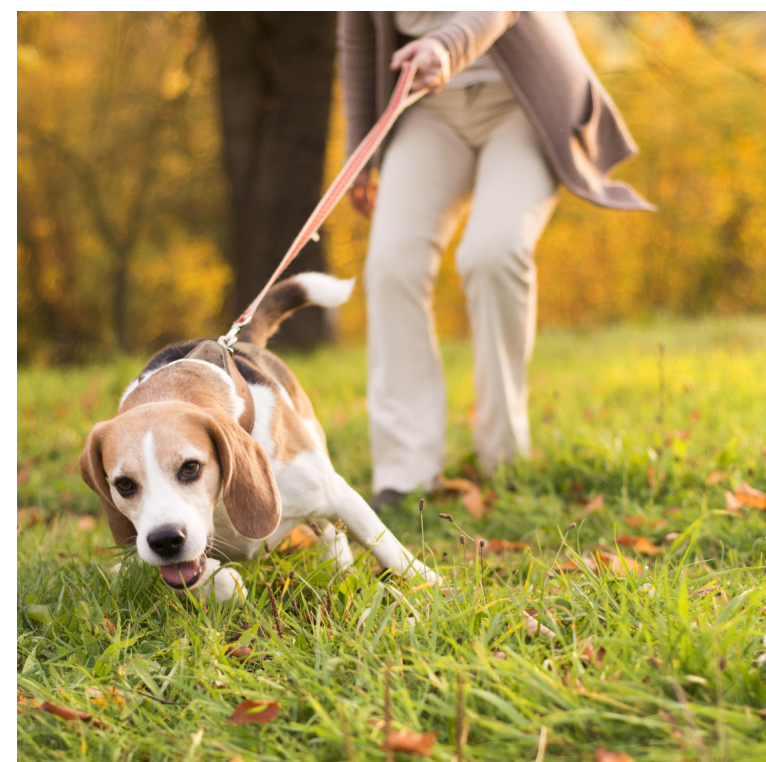
WHAT DID YOU DO LAST WEEKEND?

PAST SIMPLE

Past simple is used to describe completed actions or events that happened at a specific time in the past.

They **went** to the cinema last week.



- I **saw** my friend at the park yesterday.
- She **ate** a sandwich for lunch.

Irregular verbs: Some verbs have irregular past tense forms that don't follow the -ed rule. They must be memorized.

- I **played** soccer with my friends yesterday.
- She **watched** a movie at home last night.

Regular verbs: To form the past simple tense for regular verbs, add -ed to the base form of the verb.

- I **didn't play** soccer with my friends yesterday.
- She **didn't watch** a movie at home last night.

Negative sentences: Use the auxiliary verb did not/ didn't + the base form of the verb.

- I studied English **last night**.
- She visited her family a year **ago**.

Time expressions: Use time expressions like **yesterday/ last/ ago** to indicate when the past action or event occurred.

- **Did** you **play** soccer with your friends yesterday?
- **Did** she **watch** a movie at home last night?

Questions: To form a yes/no question in the past simple tense, use the auxiliary verb did + the subject + the base form of the verb.

She **was** very happy last week. She **wasn't** very happy last week. **Was** she very happy last week?

If there is no action in the sentence, just use was/were for negative sentences and questions.

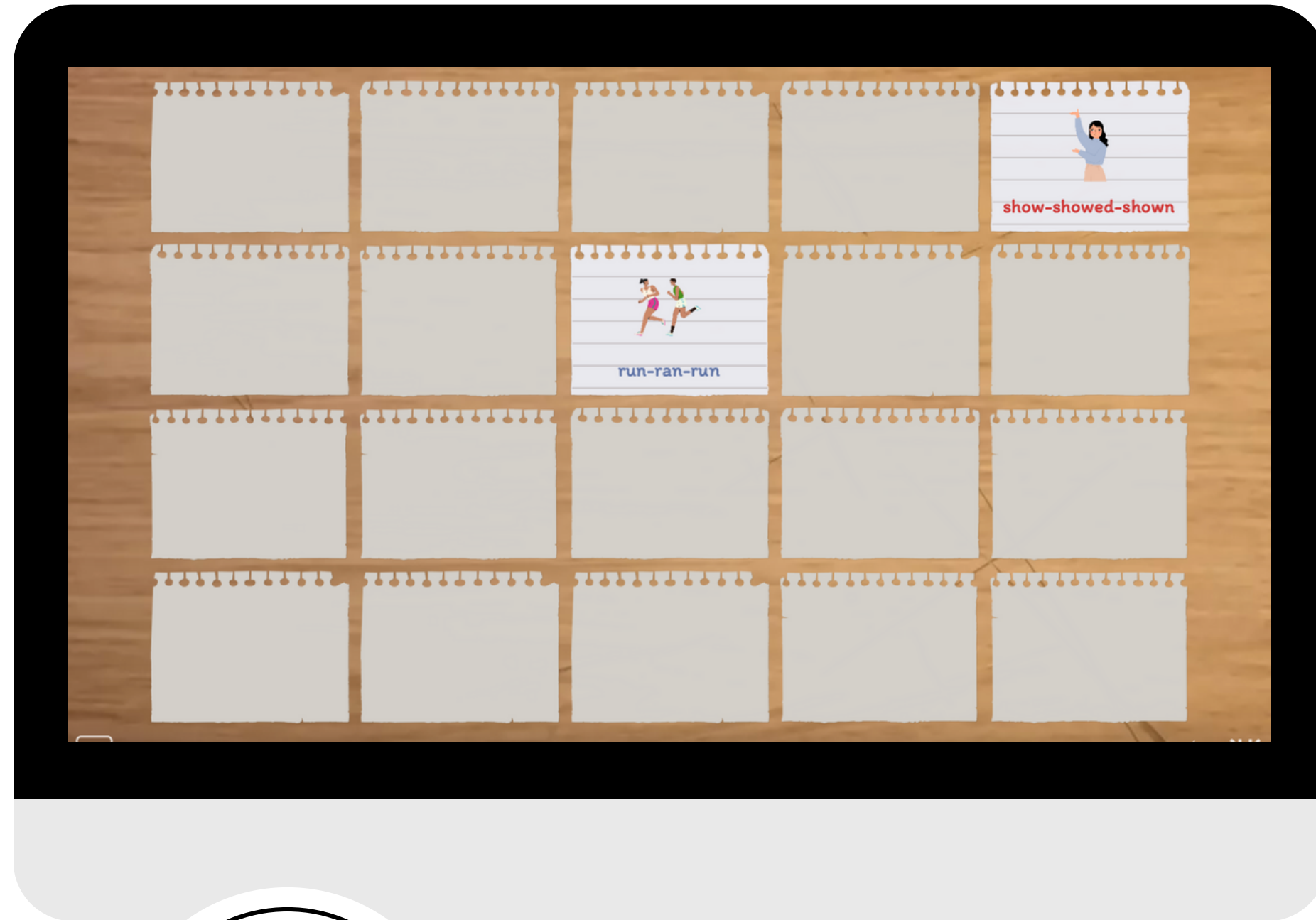

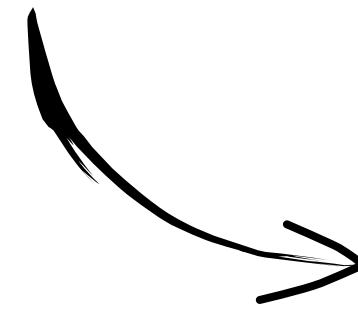
