Guest 2: Thanks!


Waiter: Is everything fine?

Recommendation is needed

Order: Starter, main course, drinks. Situation: You are really hungry but don't know what you'd like to order; ask a waiter to recommend you something and make your choice.

Billing Issue

Order: Starter, main course, dessert, drinks. Situation: The guest has ordered multiple items and wishes to pay by card, but there's an error in the bill.




