Passive voice is used when the focus is on the action. It is not important or not known, however, who or what is performing the action.
present simple
The order is taken.
Subject + to be (am/is/are)+ past participle (V3)
 past simple

The lemonade was brought cold. Subject + to be (was/were)+ past participle (V3)

| Tense |

| Present simple |
| Past simple |

Active voice
He invites me to the party.
They offered me to buy this car.

Passive voice
I am invited to the party.
I was offered to buy this car.

If we want to show the person or thing doing the action, we use "by".

Present simple
Past simple

Harry cooks breakfast every day.
Linda wrote two books.

Breakfast is cooked every day by Harry.
Two books were written by Linda.
