Wrong order

Waiter benefit

Situation: The guest isn't very hungry and is unsure about ordering a dessert. The waiter aims to sell the most expensive dessert on the menu.

Billing Issue

Order: Starter, main course, dessert, drinks. Situation: The guest has ordered multiple items and wishes to pay by card, but there's an error in the bill.

PASSIVE VOICE

Passive voice is used when the focus is on the action. It is not important or not known, however, who or what is performing the action.

present simple

The order is taken. Subject + to be (am/is/are)+ past participle (V3)



past simple

The lemonade was brought cold. Subject + to be (was/were)+ past participle (V3)

Tense	Active voice	Passive voice
Present simple	He <u>invites</u> me to the party.	I <u>am invited</u> to the party.
Past simple	They <u>offered</u> me to buy this car.	I <u>was offered</u> to buy this car.

If we want to show the person or thing doing the action, we use "by".

Present simple	Harry <u>cooks</u> breakfast every day.	Breakfast <u>is cooked</u> every day by Harry.
Past simple	Linda <u>wrote</u> two books.	Two books <u>were written by</u> Linda.




