

Use the same grammar as in the question.



LET'S TALK ABOUT FUTURE

Read and discuss the rules below. Create your own examples.

WILL

- Use "will" for spontaneous decisions or offers made at the moment of speaking. Example: Are you hot? I will open the window.
- Use "will" for predictions based on opinion or beliefs, rather than existing evidence. *Example: I think it will rain tomorrow*.

GOING TO

- Use "going to" for intentions or plans made before the moment of speaking. Example: We are going to organise a party this weekend.
- Use "going to" for predictions based on present evidence or signs. Example: Look at those clouds; it's going to rain.

PRESENT SIMPLE

- Use the present simple tense for future events that are part of a timetable or routine, like public transportation or class schedules. *Example: The train leaves at 6 pm*.
- Use the present simple tense for future events in subordinate clauses after when, as soon as, after, before, and until. Example: I'll call you when I arrive.

PRESENT CONTINUOUS


- Use the present continuous tense for future arrangements, often involving other people and usually set at a specific time and/or place. Example: We are meeting at the coffee shop at 3 pm.
- These arrangements are typically confirmed or scheduled. Example: I am flying to Paris tomorrow. I've already booked a flight.



One student is a job applicant, and the other is a hiring manager. The applicant talks about their plans for the future and how they would handle unexpected situations in the workplace.




